11.	<p>Course content: International organizations and integrations are "model" of international cooperation that aims to bring global change and face global challenges. The course analyzes the organizational structure, goals, as well as the advantages and disadvantages of the functioning of the largest international organizations: the United Nations, the International Monetary Fund, the World Bank, the World Trade Organization, as well as other important organizations in various fields of activity. The purpose of this course is to emphasize the importance and role of international organizations in world politics that is subject to constant change. Regional economic integration is also emphasized, mainly focusing on the European Union emerging as a mainstay of European integration processes.</p>
