10. | Course Objectives (Competencies):

The main objective of the course is to provide the students with in-depth knowledge of international economic relations, to help them to apply that knowledge in practice and to demonstrate competencies for identifying and analyzing current challenges. After completing the course, the students should be able to:

- conceptually distinguish the terms: integration and interdependence and critically to evaluate the role of international organizations and integration;
- to analyze the price and benefits of globalization (especially for small countries), and the need for change in the organizational structure of certain international organizations and integration;
- to understand the basic code of conduct for international organizations and integration, as well as the institutional framework of each organization;
- To understand the importance in the decision making process for membership in particular international organizations and integration;
- to identify the rights and obligations that arise from membership in certain international organizations and integration, especially for the Republic of North Macedonia.

11. Course content:

International organizations and integrations are "model" of international cooperation that aims to bring global change and face global challenges. The course analyzes the organizational structure, goals, as well as the advantages and disadvantages of the functioning of the largest international organizations: the United Nations, the International Monetary Fund, the World Bank, the World Trade Organization, as well as other important organizations in various fields of activity. The purpose of this course is to emphasize the importance and role of international organizations in world politics that is subject to constant change. Regional economic integration is also emphasized, mainly focusing on the European Union emerging as a mainstay of European integration processes.

12. Learning methods:

- 1. Presentation of the basic concepts of the international organizations and integration
- 2. Presence of guest lecturers
- 3. Application of the method of presenting the basic content elements through the Power Point system
- 4. Critical thinking about the presented issues during the classes and students' participation in discussions

5. Active student participation by presenting case studies and quizzes.
