10.	Course Objectives (Competencies):						

The course should provide basic knowledge on European regional integration processes with a particular focus on the European Union. The course provides a comprehensive analysis of the internal and external policies of the EU. After taking this course, students should be able to:

- 1. distinguish the significant characteristics and mechanisms of functioning of the various forms of economic integration:
- 2. get familiar with the strengths and weaknesses in the functioning of the regional integration;
- 3. acquire knowledge of the process of regional integration of the EU from a customs union, through an Internal European market to an economic and monetary union;
- 4. gain in-depth knowledge of common EU policies;
- 5. to be able to judge the ability and readiness of a particular candidate country to join the EU;
- 6. to measure the advantages and disadvantages of EU accession at a given level of economic development.

Course content:

The course should provide a basic knowledge of the process of integration from the customs union, the Internal European market to the economic and monetary union. The course explains the urgent development of the EU and the challenges in its functioning. EU internal and external policies are being studied. Internal policies are divided as horizontal (regional development, social policy, monetary policy, tax policy, competition policy) and sectoral (industrial, energy, transport, agricultural). In foreign policy, a special aspect is given to the foreign trade policy, where the EU's trade relations with third countries are considered. The EU is an important factor in economic and business activities in Europe. Hence, relations with Southeast European countries are a major challenge for the Republic of North Macedonia as a candidate country for EU membership.
