10.	<p><b>Course Objectives (Competencies):</b> After taking this course, students should be able to:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. understand the characteristics and functioning of the EU Internal Market;</li> <li>2. understand the new approach of harmonization, including the European standardization process and the principle of mutual recognition;</li> <li>3. understand the necessity of eliminating all qualitative, quantitative and other measures with equivalent effect in order to secure the free movement of goods within the EU;</li> <li>4. to understand the specificity of services, the possibility of applying the principle of non-discrimination and the need for exceptions to the general rules for preserving the integrity and specificity of services by simultaneously ensuring the overall functioning of the rules of the EU Internal Market;</li> <li>5. to understand the need for harmonization of tax and fiscal policies as a precondition for the free movement of capital in the EU;</li> <li>6. to distinguish the rights of free movement of labour force and free movement of inactive persons in the Internal Market.</li> </ol>				
11.	<p>7. Course content: This subject aims to clearly present the functioning of the EU Internal Market through the four freedoms: free movement of goods, services, capital and labour. Each of the four freedoms is based on separate legislation that was based on the law cases of the European Court of Justice. Given the specificity and individuality of the legal sources, each of the separate legal frameworks on which is based the free movement of goods, services, capital, and labour is analysed separately. The final aim of the course is to get the real picture and understand the complexity of the system within the European Union.</p>				
12.	<p>Learning methods:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Presentation of the basic concepts of the EU Internal Market</li> <li>2. Presence of guest lecturers</li> <li>3. Application of the method of presenting the basic content elements through the Power Point system</li> <li>4.
