10.	<p>Course Objectives (Competencies): The aim of the course is to enable students to gain in-depth knowledge of the operational aspect of international supply chains. Students are introduced to the complexity and mode of operation of international supply chains with a focus on the implementation of transport, logistics and insurance of goods in international trade. By acquiring knowledge from this course, students will be able to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Understand the functioning of international supply chains; - Fully understand the INCOTERMS rules; - Understand and distinguish the specifics of certain types of international transport of goods; - Understand the importance of maritime transport, maritime industry and the functioning of ports; - Understand the importance of road transport and the status of landlocked countries; - Understand the importance and role of rail transport; - Understand the importance of air transport; - Understand the way of functioning of the modern transport systems; - Understand the functioning of international freight forwarding; - Understand the importance of trade logistics and the role of the logistics operator; - Understand the importance of insurance of goods in international transport; - Fully understand the instruments for payment abroad; - Understand the importance of documents in international trade; - Understand the importance and the impact of the administrative and customs procedures on international trade. 				
11.	<p>Course content: The course International Transport and Logistics deals with the operational aspects of the international supply chains. The course begins with an analysis of the meaning and application of the INCOTERMS rules in international trade. The course aims to present the different types of international transport of goods: sea, road, rail and air, through the study of their specifics and the analysis of various conventions for unified international regulation: rights and obligations of carriers, liability of carriers, rights and obligations of senders and recipients, development and the importance of ports, the state of landlocked countries, the development of regional supply chains, etc. Special emphasis in the curriculum is given to the development of the freight forwarding activity and its growth into trade logistics, as well as the development and role of the logistics operators in international trade. The course also stresses the importance of the insurance of goods in the international transport and places a special emphasis on the risks to which goods in the international trade are exposed, and the damages that very often occur during their transport. Within the curriculum, the payment instruments that are an integral part of the</p>				

	international trade in goods, the documents in the international trade and the need for their harmonization will also be studied. At the end of the course, special emphasis is given to the importance of various administrative and customs procedures and their impact on international trade.
